Last year we were extremely blessed to have our generous community support our Annual Fund Eaglethon Campaign. Additionally, we were awarded a prestigious Yass Prize Education award. This along with state, private, and charitable grants helped bridge the gap between tuition income and school expenses allowing us to provide quality Catholic education and support student programs, academic enhancements, and campus improvements.

Highlights include:

SMB CURRICULUM KINDERGARTEN-8TH GRADE

St. Mary-Basha Catholic School has selected rigorous curriculum in core subject areas with consideration for emphasis of reading and conceptual comprehension, engaging and interactive activities, and variety of differentiated instruction materials to help teachers meet the needs of all students in their classroom.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

The SuperKids Reading program from Zaner-Bloser is a comprehensive K-2 reading program that is designed to help students develop the essential skills they need to become successful readers. The program is based on the following principles:

Key features of the SuperKids Reading program:

- Explicit instruction in all aspects of reading: The program provides explicit instruction in all aspects of reading, including phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, and grammar.
- Systematic and sequential instruction: The program is organized in a systematic and sequential way, so that students learn new skills in a logical order.
- Engaging and interactive activities: The program uses a variety of engaging and interactive activities to keep students motivated and interested in learning to read.
- Family resources: The program includes a variety of resources for families, such as parent guides and home activities.

The Journeys and Voyages ELA curriculum is utilized in grades 3-8.

Key features of Journeys and Voyages curriculum:

- Focus on reading comprehension: Students
 are taught how to identify the main idea and
 supporting details of a text, make inferences,
 analyze context, and draw conclusions.
- Integration of the State Standards: This
 ensures that students are learning the skills
 they need to be successful in college and
 careers.
- Variety of text types: Students are exposed to a variety of different text types, including fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and drama which helps students to develop reading skills and to learn about different genres of literature.
- Engaging and interactive activities: The curriculum includes a variety of engaging and interactive activities to help students learn and practice the skills they are being taught.

SOCIAL STUDIES

Social Studies curriculum is unique to each grade and allows for the integration of faith into all aspects of the curriculum, as students explore social studies concepts through the lens of their Catholic faith.

Key features of Social Studies curriculum:

- Focus on Community: Students study and understand community and the different types of communities in which they belong.
- **Focus on Citizenship:** Students explore the rights and responsibilities of citizenship.
- Focus on History: Students examine how history has shaped the world they live in today and connect with the past on a personal level.
- Focus on Stewardship: Students identify the ways in which they can be stewards of God's creation.
- Focus Justice and Peace: Students engage in service project activities and discussions of Catholic social teaching on these subjects.



SMB CURRICULUM KINDERGARTEN-8TH GRADE

MATHEMATICS

Big Ideas Math is a comprehensive mathematics curriculum designed to help students develop a deep understanding of mathematical concepts based on the following principles: visible learning, conceptual understanding, problem-solving, and student engagement.

Key features of Big Ideas Math:

- Learning Targets and Success Criteria: This
 helps students to understand what they are
 expected to learn and how they will be
 assessed.
- Visual Learning: Engaging visuals and diagrams help students understand complex mathematical concepts.
- Math Practices: Big Ideas Math integrates State Standards for Mathematical Practice into every lesson which helps students to develop their mathematical skills.
- Comprehensive Assessment: A variety of formative and summative assessments help teachers track student progress and identify areas where students need additional support.

RELIGION

Be My Disciple is a Catholic religious education curriculum that emphasizes learning and practicing the skills and habits, virtues and spiritual gifts that lead young disciples to higher levels of moral thinking.

Be My Disciple is based on the following principles:

- Christ-centered: Students are invited to encounter Jesus through Scripture, prayer, and the sacraments.
- Balanced: Students learn about the Catholic faith through the four pillars of catechesis: Scripture, Tradition, Liturgy, and Magisterium.
- Engaging: Students are given opportunities to move, to sing, to pray, and to reflect.
- Formative: Students are helped to develop their critical thinking skills, their moral compass, and their relationship with God.

SCIENCE

Amplify Science is a research-based curriculum that has been shown to improve student learning outcomes.

Key features of Amplify Science:

- Phenomena-based instruction: Units are organized around compelling phenomena that students investigate and learn from.
- Hands-on investigations: Students learn by doing in a variety of hands-on investigations.
- Literacy-rich activities: A variety of literacy-rich activities help students develop their reading, writing, and speaking skills.
- Interactive digital tools: The digital platform provides students with access to interactive simulations, data visualizations, and other tools that help them to learn and explore scientific concepts in a deeper way.

SMB PRESCHOOL & PRE-KINDERGARTEN



St. Mary-Basha Catholic Preschool is a Christ-centered, play-based learning environment. Children develop math, science, language, social, spiritual, and emotional skills through a wide variety of activities. Our caring and professionally-trained staff, in partnership with the family, will teach the skills each child needs to be successful in kindergarten. St. Mary-Basha Catholic Preschool embraces the developmental philosophy of learning, which respects each child as a unique individual, and supports the knowledge that young children learn best through play and hands-on experiences.











CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, also known as Atrium, is a worldwide religious formation program for children Preschool to First Grade at St. Mary-Basha. The goal of Atrium is to fulfill the religious potential of the baptized child.

The Christ-centered catechesis in the Atrium allows children to come closer to God through Christ. Children gather in a room specially prepared for them (an 'atrium') which contains simple yet beautiful materials to grow in their faith and participate in the liturgy.





ENRICHMENT CURRICULUM KINDERGARTEN-6TH GRADE

Enrichment classes are an important part of a holistic Catholic school education. Students have the opportunity to learn about a variety of subjects in addition to the regular core curriculum. Students develop their creativity, problem-solving skills, and critical thinking skills while exploring subjects that may pique new interests and talents. With a hands on approach to enrichment classes, students develop skills that are vital for success in high school, college and beyond.

In addition to these general benefits, enrichment classes are an important part of a Catholic school education because they can help students to develop their spirituality. Students learn to express their faith through the arts, foreign language and culture, as well as develop a sense of teamwork and community.











JUNIOR HIGH EXPERIENCE

At St. Mary-Basha Catholic School, we prioritize a holistic education, fostering your child's intellectual, spiritual, and social growth through a challenging curriculum aligned with the highest standards. Explore the Junior High benefits below:

- Differentiated math: We offer a variety of math courses to meet the needs of all of our students - both on grade level and advanced mathematics.
- · Science Fair: Students "learn science by doing science," which is exemplified by the Science Project Portfolio that guides students through the process of designing and conducting a science experiment and communicating their results. The project culminates with a science fair where students showcase their work.
- Honors placement in high school: Our students are well-prepared for the rigors of high school. A majority of our students go on to place in honors and AP courses.
- Community and service: We believe in the importance of giving back to our community. Our students build community through service to our parish, school, and local organizations.
- Theology of the Body: We offer a unique course on Theology of the Body, which teaches students about the beauty and dignity of the human person.
- 7th Grade Science Camp: Students spend two days and nights at University of Arizona's Sky School at Steward Observatory atop Mt. Lemmon, where they design and conduct an ecological investigation, explore the geology of southern Arizona, and see stellar nurseries and other astronomical phenomena using the observatory's telescopes.
- A Journey to the Nation's Capital: Each year, our 8th grade students embark on a trip to Washington, DC, immersing themselves in the rich history and government of our nation.
- High school scholarships: We are committed to making Catholic education affordable beyond St. Mary-Basha. Several scholarships assist families in affording Catholic high school.






Fiscal Year 2022-2023
