Dan McBride and a devoted team committed to inspiring minds, nurturing faith, and building community.

Through your generosity and support of the Annual Fund Eaglethon Campaign, along with grants and additional funding, we have continued to enhance the student experience, strengthen academic programs, and provide meaningful opportunities for every child.

This year's milestones include:

- Recognition as an Apple Distinguished School, celebrating innovation, leadership, and educational excellence in technology integration
- Completion of a successful WCEA Accreditation Visit, earning a full six year accreditation that affirms our commitment to Catholic education
- Expansion of student support services with full time Reading and Math Interventionists, including the conversion of an office into a dedicated Math Intervention classroom
- Implementation of spiritual retreats at half of our grade levels, deepening faith formation and strengthening our Catholic identity
- Introduction of a new Social Studies curriculum, enriching learning through faith, inquiry, and discovery
- Creation of a Green Screen Room to expand student creativity and media production opportunities
- PreK playground upgrades, including new toys and equipment to support active play and early childhood development
- Receipt of a \$15,000 grant from the Catholic Community Foundation to support our ongoing playground renovation
- Plumbing upgrades beneath the road between the rectory and library to ensure long term facility integrity
- Implementation of GiveButter CRM and Double the Donation, streamlining fundraising and donor engagement

SMB Curriculum Kindergarten-8th Grade

St. Mary-Basha Catholic School has selected rigorous curriculum in core subject areas with consideration for emphasis of reading and conceptual comprehension, engaging and interactive activities, and variety of differentiated instruction materials to help teachers meet the needs of all students in their classroom.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Kindergarten-2nd Grade

The SuperKids Reading program from Zaner-Bloser is a comprehensive K-2 reading program that is designed to help students develop the essential skills they need to become successful readers. The program is based on the following principles:

Key features of the SuperKids Reading program:

- Explicit instruction in all aspects of reading: The program provides explicit instruction in all aspects of reading, including phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, and grammar.
- Systematic and sequential instruction: The program is organized in a systematic and sequential way, so that students learn new skills in a logical order.
- Engaging and interactive activities: The program uses a variety of engaging and interactive activities to keep students motivated and interested in learning to read.
- Family resources: The program includes a variety of resources for families, such as parent guides and home activities.

3rd - 8th Grades

St. Mary-Basha utilizes the Wonders curriculum for grades 3–5 and StudySync for grades 6–8.

Key Features:

- Focus on Reading Comprehension: Both programs emphasize understanding complex texts through identifying main ideas and supporting details, analyzing context, making inferences, and drawing conclusions.
- Alignment with State Standards: Lessons are designed to ensure students build the literacy and critical-thinking skills necessary for success in high school, college, and beyond.
- Variety of Text Types: Students engage with a diverse range of genres, including fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and drama, fostering an appreciation for literature and informational texts.
- Engaging and Interactive Learning: Through digital and print components, students participate in interactive lessons, collaborative discussions, and writing activities that deepen comprehension and strengthen communication skills.

SOCIAL STUDIES

The MyWorld Social Studies curriculum at St. Mary-Basha Catholic School offers a well-rounded education in history, civics, geography, and economics for grades 1-8, with integrated faith elements.

Highlights by grade include:

- Grades 1-3: Community roles, local government, and citizenship basics.
- Grades 4-5: U.S. founding, government principles, and cultural diversity.
- Grades 6-7: In-depth American history, U.S. regions, and current issues.
- Grade 8: World history, global events, and ethical discussions.

This structure ensures a thorough social studies foundation rooted in faith and values.



SMB Curriculum Kindergarten-8th Grade

Mathematics

Big Ideas Math is a comprehensive mathematics curriculum designed to help students develop a deep understanding of mathematical concepts based on the following principles: visible learning, conceptual understanding, problem-solving, and student engagement.

Key features of Big Ideas Math:

- Learning Targets and Success Criteria: This
 helps students to understand what they are
 expected to learn and how they will be
 assessed.
- Visual Learning: Engaging visuals and diagrams help students understand complex mathematical concepts.
- Math Practices: Big Ideas Math integrates State Standards for Mathematical Practice into every lesson which helps students to develop their mathematical skills.
- Comprehensive Assessment: A variety of formative and summative assessments help teachers track student progress and identify areas where students need additional support.

Religion

At St. Mary-Basha Catholic School, we use the following religious education programs:

- Grades K-5: Be My Disciple curriculum, which fosters moral development and spiritual growth through Scripture, prayer, sacraments, and engaging activities.
- Grades 6-8: Christ Our Life curriculum, designed to deepen students' understanding of Catholic doctrine and their personal relationship with Jesus through ageappropriate teachings rooted in Scripture, Tradition, and the Sacraments.
- Grades K-8: Theology of the Body, integrated into our curriculum across all grades, introduces students to the Catholic Church's teachings on the dignity of the human person, relationships, and the value of the body, helping them form a respectful and faith-based understanding of human relationships and personal identity.

These programs together provide a comprehensive foundation in faith, character, and moral development for all students.

Science

At St. Mary-Basha Catholic School, we use Amplify Science, a proven curriculum enhanced by Mystery Science for added exploration.

Key features:

- Phenomena-based learning: Units organized around intriguing phenomena.
- Hands-on investigations: Active, experiential learning.
- Literacy integration: Reading, writing, and speaking skill-building.
- Interactive tools: Digital simulations and visualizations for deeper understanding.

Amplify and Mystery Science together spark curiosity and deepen students' grasp of scientific concepts.





Enrichment Curriculum Kindergarten-6th grade

Enrichment classes are an important part of a holistic Catholic school education. Students have the opportunity to learn about a variety of subjects in addition to the regular core curriculum. Students develop their creativity, problem-solving skills, and critical thinking skills while exploring subjects that may pique new interests and talents. With a hands on approach to enrichment classes, students develop skills that are vital for success in high school, college and beyond.

In addition to these general benefits, enrichment classes are an important part of a Catholic school education because they can help students to develop their spirituality. Students learn to express their faith through the arts, foreign language and culture, as well as develop a sense of teamwork and community.











Junior High Experience

At St. Mary-Basha Catholic School, we prioritize a holistic education, fostering your child's intellectual, spiritual, and social growth through a challenging curriculum aligned with the highest standards. Explore the Junior High benefits below:

- Differentiated math: We offer a variety of math courses to meet the needs of all of our students - both on grade level and advanced mathematics.
- Science Fair: Students "learn science by doing science," which is exemplified by the Science Project Portfolio that guides students through the process of designing and conducting a science experiment and communicating their results. The project culminates with a science fair where students showcase their work.
- Honors placement in high school: Our students are well-prepared for the rigors of high school. A majority of our students go on to place in honors and AP courses.
- Community and service: We believe in the importance of giving back to our community. Our students build community through service to our parish, school, and local organizations.
- Theology of the Body: We offer a unique course on Theology of the Body, which teaches students about the beauty and dignity of the human person.
- 7th Grade Science Camp: Students spend two days and nights at University of Arizona's Sky School at Steward Observatory atop Mt. Lemmon, where they design and conduct an ecological investigation, explore the geology of southern Arizona, and see stellar nurseries and other astronomical phenomena using the observatory's telescopes.
- A Journey to the Nation's Capital: Each year, our 8th grade students embark on a trip to Washington, DC, immersing themselves in the rich history and government of our nation.
- High school scholarships: We are committed to making Catholic education affordable beyond St. Mary-Basha. Several scholarships assist families in affording Catholic high school.

Iowa Test Results

Understanding the Iowa Test Results (Spring 2025)

The Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS) is a nationally-normed achievement test that assesses your child's foundational and higher-order thinking skills in Reading, Language, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science.

The ITBS is just one type of assessment we use to evaluate academic growth and progress. Growth is also evaluated by quarterly STAR testing, individual student testing, and teacher assessments.

The ITBS is a norm-referenced test, meaning it compares your student's performance to peers across the entire United States. The 50th percentile is considered the national average. This is different from the state's AZMERIT test, which is criterion-referenced and only measures performance against specific Arizona state standards.

The chart below highlights our Spring 2025 ITBS results by comparing the St. Mary-Basha Catholic School grade-level averages to the overall average scores of all K-8 Catholic schools in the Diocese of Phoenix. The charts display our Grade Equivalent scores in the core areas of Math, Reading, and Language Skills.

Grade Equivalent (GE) Score Explained: A Grade Equivalent score of 3.5, for example, means the student scored similarly to a student in the fifth month of the 3rd grade.

Key Trend: We are proud to report a strong, consistent trend: our average grade equivalency scores increase continuously as students progress through each grade. This growth pattern is characteristic of Diocese of Phoenix Catholic Schools and typically contrasts with the flattening achievement trend observed in many public middle school grades.






